Introducing the Inaugural Jameson Fellowship Collective Impact Grant

When Dr. Gard Jameson formed the Jameson Fellowship several years ago, he recognized that as our community continues to mature, there is a growing realization that we must build the tissue of trust and connectivity between organizations in order to discover novel and creative ways of addressing our community's needs. As we deepen the level of trust, we likewise expand our capacity for solving problems that require organizations to work together to truly impact the lives of others. With this in mind, Drs. Gard & Florence Jameson are proud to announce the inaugural **\$25,000 Jameson Fellowship Collective Impact Grant to be awarded to partnering organizations.**

Expectations and Procedures

I. Applicant Eligibility

- a. Applicants may be a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, academic institution, law enforcement or governmental agency that is licensed and operates within the state of Nevada.
- b. Applicants must demonstrate a collaborative partnership with at least one other organization that will work together to collectively impact a current community need that addresses one of the following focus areas:
 - Homelessness
 - Food Insecurity
 - Gender Identity
 - Mental Wellness
 - Educational Enrichment Programs
 - Social and Emotional Growth Initiatives
 - Nutrition
- c. The applicants may not be a single individual or stand-alone organization.
- d. One of the applicants must have previously been or currently be a Jameson Fellow (2013-2019).

II. Application Requirements

- a. Applicants must specify concrete evidenced-based examples of a successful collaborative partnership with at least one other organization that addresses a community need within the next 12 months.
- b. Application narratives should be no more than 750 words and must include how metrics will demonstrate the number of lives impacted.
- c. Applications must demonstrate how the program/project will be sustained long-term.
- d. Applicants must not be organizations that discriminate, either in employment or in delivery of services, on any basis prohibited by law, including race, national origin, color, creed, gender/sex, sexual orientation, transgender status, religion, political beliefs, disability, or perceived disability, or veteran status.

- e. Funds will not be awarded to individuals, stand-alone organizations or to “pass through” organizations.
- f. Contact information should accompany the application.
- g. Multiple submissions from the same collaborative partners/organizations are not allowed. Individual organizations cannot seek funding to fulfil the same need with different partners. For example, if organization A submits an entry with Organization B to address food insecurity, Organization A and Organization B cannot submit a second proposal to address homelessness (same collaborative partners, different project). Additionally, Organization A cannot submit a second proposal with Organization C to address food insecurity (same project from one collaborative partner).
- h. If more than one is received, the first submission will be considered the submission of record.

III. Required Information

- a. Names and contact information from the collaborative organizations.
- b. 501(c)3 Determination Number (if applicable).
- c. Board of Directors List and Company Affiliations (if applicable).

IV. Application Process

- a. Applications will be processed entirely on line using the following link:

- b. The application window opens June 14, 2019 and closes August 30, 2019.
- c. A screening committee will be identified to review all entries and the \$25K Jameson Fellowship grant will be awarded after August 30, 2019.
